**COURSE DESCRIPTION** 

Looking to brush up on your knowledge of federal child welfare law and learn tips to enhance your representation of children, parents, or the agency? Then join us for the Red Book Training Course!

NACC's signature Red Book Training Course covers major dependency practice competency areas and is designed to assist you in preparing for the Child Welfare Law Specialist (CWLS) examination. The course is based on NACC's legal treatise, Child Welfare Law and Practice: Representing Children, Parents, and Agencies in Neglect, Abuse, and Dependency Cases, 4th Edition (the Red Book). During eight weekly webinars, the presenter will assist participants in breaking the material down, focusing on important concepts, and learning CWLS exam-taking strategies.

Registration includes the live sessions, the downloadable RBTC workbook, and temporary access to the electronic version of the Red Book and session recordings to view on-demand.

IMPORTANT: The following page includes the sections of the Red Book and corresponding chapters that will be covered in each session. Prior to each week it will be helpful (but not required) if you have read the chapters and sections that will be covered. This course will not cover every chapter in the Red Book. The instructor has made intentional decisions about what information to cover in the time that is allotted for the course. If a chapter is not covered, that does not mean that content from that chapter will not appear on the exam. Therefore, you should incorporate any chapters that are not covered into your self-study plans.
